If you arrive in Chamberlain on Thursday, perhaps you will want to experience one or more of these attractions.

Akta Lakota Museum--Art, artifacts and educational displays of the proud Lakota (Sioux) heritage and culture. Free Admission. Open 8am--6pm. Located on the campus of St. Joseph's Indian School, 1301 North Main Street, Chamberlain.

South Dakota Hall of Fame--Dedicates itself to the honoring of South Dakota People, Past, Present & Future! The Hall of Fame honors South Dakotans and their contributions to the development and heritage of the state. Features a South Dakota gift shop. Free Admission. Open 10 AM to 8 PM Monday – Friday. Just off exit 263, 1480 S Main Street, Chamberlain

Lewis and Clark Information Center-- Commemorates the Lewis & Clark expedition as they voyaged through South Dakota, featuring interpretive panels and murals. Take the scenic walk and view the Missouri River and the community of Chamberlain-Oacoma from a replica keelboat. At the Chamberlain Rest Area on Interstate 90 between Exits 263 and 265. Free admission. Handicap accessible. Open 8 AM to 8 PM.

F & B Antiques--Open from 10 AM to 7 PM. On the I-90 business loop exit 260.

Old West Trading Post--Open from 10 AM to 6 PM. On the I-90 business loop exit 260.

Barger Park View --Offers a great view of the river. Located right along the bike/walking trail, it is a great rest stop to put up your feet, throw a penny in the fountain, or relax. Located on the North end of Main Street, Chamberlain.
